Since November 1st 1998 is full professor of Surveying and Mapping at the University of Padua.
Director of the Department of Architecture, Urban Planning and Surveying (DAUR) at the Faculty of Engineering of the University of Padua from November 1st, 1999 to October 31, 2005.
Member of the Scientific Council of SIFET (Topography and Photogrammetry Italian Society) in the period 2001-2003.
Member of the Scientific Council of SAIA (Archaeological Italian School of Athens) since 2008.
Since December 1998 is the director of LRG (Laboratory of Surveying and Geomatics) at the Civil, Environmental and Architectural Engineering Department (DICEA) of the University of Padua.

The scientific activity concerns surveying problems related to geodetic, topographic and photogrammetric applications, on small, medium and large scale.
Author of more than 250 scientific publications on national and international journals.
